MIN 01/06/2022 REVIEW OF FBO CONSTITUENCY FEEDBACK MEETING OBJECTIVES

The Faith Based Organisations (FBOs) under the umbrella body of Kenya Faith Based Health Services

Consortium (KFBHSC) held their Constituency feedback meeting for Global Fund at Maanzoni Lodge

in Machakos County developed this communique to be submitted to Global Fund Geneva, KCM Chair

and the PRs.

The Government of Kenya (GoK) works in collaboration with the National Faith –Based Organisations

and their affiliate member organisations listed below:

1. Kenya Conference of Catholic Bishops (KCCB)

2. National Council of Churches of Kenya (NCCK)

3. Supreme Council of Kenya Muslims (SUPKEM)

4. Christian Health Association of Kenya (CHAK)

5. Mission for Essential Drugs and Supplies (MEDS)

The above organisations formed an umbrella body 10 years ago known as the Kenya Faith Based Health

Services Consortium (KFBHSC) to drive the health agenda in partnership with the Ministry of Health

and development partners. FBOs contribute to approximately 40% of the health care services in Kenya

mostly in the rural and hard to reach areas across the Country serving community members affected by

the three disease burden.

The highlight of the meeting was the representation of Director General of Health's office Dr Mulwa

who gave cordial greetings from Dr Patrick Amoth and commended the partnership that existed between

FBO's and MOH.

The FBO'S received a rare opportunity to present their asks regarding NHIF and NACC board

representation in the new NHIF amendment bill. They also requested if Global Fund procurement and

supply of TB, Malaria and HIV commodities could be sources through MEDS collaboration.

MIN 02/06/2022: FBO REPRESENTATION AT NHIF

SUPKEM representative Shaban Latif is currently serving last year of the final term. The NHIF act is

also likely to get amended and there is need to lobby against the replacement of FBO representative at

NHIF. NHIF liquidity has also improved compared to 2019 and the fund is currently able to pay for

claims. NHIF has been allocated more funds for UHC to increase on the services currently being offered

to reach more facilities.

MIN 03/06/2022: PROCUREMENT OF PROGRAM COMMODITIES

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Concerning the issues with procurement delays and hitches FBO would like to introduce Missions for Essential Drug Supply (MEDs) very vibrant supply chain management system for consideration as an alternative complementary procurement mechanism to KEMSA. MEDS is WHO prequalified and offer efficient and effective supply chain and management which has been serving not only FBO facilities but also County Governments and some private facilities.

#### MIN 04/02/2022: STRATEGIC COLLABORATION WITHIN FBO CONSTITUENCY

FBOs to focus work together in the following areas

- ✓ Identify strength for each FBO constituency and prepare a joint proposal
- ✓ Organize for a Zoom meeting to strategize on how to secure opportunity for SR and PR in future.
- ✓ KFBHSC to continuously high level advocacy for FBO at the policy level with active engagement with the Government and Donors such as USAID. Adopt the same strategy for Global Fund.
- ✓ Explore the opportunities for Joint bids for some specific request for proposals.
- ✓ FBO community to consider engaging MEDS for capacity in proposal writing;
- ✓ Consider opportunities for partnerships among the FBOs to leverage on each other strength.
- ✓ FBO community to identify the gaps and build the case on what they can offer to fill the existing gaps. KFBHSC to share the template by March to be able to compete by March 2021.
- ✓ Improve communication among the members to be addressed by the common email and
- ✓ KFBHSC ensure consistency of the people attending the KCM meetings- New people take time to learn what is happening:
- ✓ There is need for further engagement with the NHIF to expedite the process of payment to health facilities.
- ✓ The FBO constituency resolved to carry on with the activities planned for the year 2020 that was disrupted by COVID19 with amendment of dates.

#### MIN 05/02/2022: Way Forward

➤ KFBHSC to engage PRs in advance to prepare on how to respond to RFP as SR

- ➤ Plan for capacity building for the FBOs by the PRs- This needs to be urgent before the beginning of the next funding cycle: **Action: KCM.**
- > Develop a mailing list for the consistent members for KCM- FBO constituent to ease of communications and engagement with the PRs: **Action: KCM.**
- > Ensure representation of the FBO at the Health system policy level to influence policy to make UHC a reality. **Action KCM.**
- Active engagement with the government for equitable allocation of resources as sure gender balance for the representatives attending KCM meeting. Action: KCM.
- ➤ Malaria focus on western Kenya only- Consider other areas Eg Kapendo, review the disease demographics. **Action: MOH.**
- ➤ National and County Government to support the FBO constituency for the role played in responding to health crisis during the industrial action by the Health Care workers. **Action: MOH.**
- Ensure feedback in SR selection; publish the list of the successful and unsuccessful bids Action: PRs
- ➤ Distribution of the Global Fund supported PPE by the government to consider health workers in Faith Based health facilities. **Action: MOH.**
- > Proposal for the KCM to consider moving meeting to other parts of the country such as Kericho.
- > The CEOs or the top leadership of the PRs organization to be attending KCM Constituency meeting to respond to members questions: **Action: KCM.**
