OUTLINE: CONSTITUENCY FEEDBACK MEETING/GC7 DIALOGUE REPORT
17TH – 18TH APRIL ESERIAN THE RESORT

Introduction

The purpose of this report is to provide a summary of the discussions and outcomes of the meeting and to highlight key findings and recommendations. Feedback on what is working and what is not and to see the way forward towards making things work. The feedback meeting also provides forum for the review of constituencies work plans and development of new plans for the subsequent grants implementation period. The people of interest are the adolescent and young persons (AYP) from 10 constituencies in the country whose participation is crucial due to the high HIV, TB, and Malaria among the young people.

Purpose and Objectives of the Constituency feedback Meeting /GC7 Dialogue

The KCM AYP constituency feedback meeting was held to take stock of achievements of the constituency and highlight challenges and solutions for subsequent periods as well as set priorities for the coming years in the form of a work plan.

Update constituency members on Funding Request Application /Grant Making/SR Selection Process.

Objectives include.

1. Engage with Constituency Members and discuss the key priorities and strategic interventions to be included in the Global Fund Funding request application and COP 23 Planning process.
2. Discuss Achievements, Programmatic gaps, Areas of Improvement, and lessons learned to inform the GC7 and COP 23 Planning process.
3. Update Constituency Members on EPA Requirements and KCM Evolution Project.
4. Update constituency members on the progress on implementation of GF and PEPFAR Grants
5. Discuss 2022/2023 Constituency report / 2023/2024 Work plan/Budget.

Highlights of sessions covered during the meeting

Day one

The GC7 dialogue meeting was opened with introductions by everybody in the room and soon after the meeting started. During the first session by the Kenya Coordinating Mechanism representative, we had in-depth discussions on how KCM is structured as well as global fund and how it works and the monies the country has been allocated to deal with certain issues i.e. hiv, tb and malaria. Global fund has allocated Kenya 392.989,068 and the purpose of this meeting is to make sure that AYP objectives are included in the the grant which starts in 2024 and the writing should start soon after these two days meeting to meet the submission date on 21st august.

Discussion/key action points/recommendations

Gaps Identified

- On the previous Grant making process the consultant brought on board did not prioritize the needs of the young people suggested by their representatives.
- Limited slots given to young people in the writing team hence not providing a chance for equal representation.
- Limited resources to support the young people to meaningfully engage in the writing process.
- Tax compliance: most youth led organizations do not have which is one of the reasons that locks them out to be SR.
- Limited engagement of young people in the malaria response

Proposed Interventions/Recommendations

- Allocation of Resources towards supporting the AYP in the writing team to meaningfully engage in the process.
- Increase the number of young people present in the writing team.
- Allocation of one technical person to support AYP in the writing process.
- Bringing on board a consultant that is youth friendly and recognizes the expertise of young people.
- Building the capacity of youth led organization to be able to strengthen their governance systems to qualify as SRs.
- Inclusion of AYP in the malaria response in the next grant

Young people are always involved in the process unless they decide not to be part of it, they have equal rights to any other partners. 2. <p>How do you ensure the AYPs are not bullied and intimidated</p>	<p>Come together and have one voice because partners thrive on the confusion of the AYP.</p> <p>The first step to avoid bullying is to call out the bullies out and action will be taken against them.</p>
<p>Who have been selected as the writing team to represent the AYPs</p>	<p>The list of the 10 representatives will be shared for all members to know and avoid any confusion.</p>
<p>1. Highlight the consultants that are on the AYP side and will be able to give knowledge on how to do the write up 2. There should be a feedback meeting to air out any issues experienced to improve for the next writing.</p>	<p>The consultants will be notified to the writing committee.</p>

<p>why are people who use drugs excluded?</p>	<p>The country prioritizes who needs to be included based on some reasons. If you can. Justify why they need to be included then it can be done.</p>
<p>What happens if there are no test kits</p>	<p>That i not within the Kenya red cross mandate it's beyond the control of red cross. It belongs to pr1 i.e., treasury, ideally the most push should come from the community. Targets are not set by Kenya red cross but the country. If there are any changes then reallocation is done and approved by global fund</p>
<p>How are the targets determined</p>	<p>Targets are put depending on the size estimates which size estimates were they using which year, available interventions for people.</p>
<p>How are defaulters reached or located</p>	<p>Tracing is done through phone and may not yield return so how is this person reached, they go beyond the facility to the community to the community workers and trace them physically and find out if the patient has moved to a different facility or relocated.</p>

Day two

The day started off by the members going to their respective groups to discuss the interventions that should be done. After presentations of the interventions the Amref representative took to the front to discuss issues on TB and thereafter the Kenya aids strategic framework was discussed.

Is there an aspect of mental health support after treatment	There is a gap in this no specific services are offered for mental health
Why did some counties not reach their goals	Each country has their own problems such as covid 19, commodity stock out

How is awareness reaching the grassroot person	By community links through chvs
Why is there limited attention to males	More activities are being structures to include the male

The AYPs were able to give their feedback on the things that did not work and some recommendation on the global fund grant and where to improve from what was previous done. Further to this the AYPs gave their grievances on what they experienced and especially on being bullied by members largely because they are young.

The comments and suggestions by the AYP constituency members throughout the meeting and especially during the plenary discussions are consolidated to form part of these report's recommendations. The meeting was generally successfully and ended at 4pm.
